Regional News Round-Up

The Carroll County Board of commissioners plans to issue bonds to provide stopgap funding for the county's 5% share of the cost of a runway relocation and safety project at **Carroll County Regional Airport**; most of the \$88 million will be paid by the FAA.

Charles County is considering new zoning categories that would enable further development near **Maryland Airport**.

FauquierNow has profiled Ken Peppard, a retired FAA program manager and the No. 1 volunteer at **Warrenton-Fauquier Airport** (http://www.fauquiernow.com/index.php/fauquier_news/article/fauquier-qa-he-has-volunteered-1200-hours-at-county-airport-2-2019). In other Warrenton-Fauquier Airport news, the new terminal is about 30% complete and construction of the \$4.5 million facility is expected to be completed in July.

Winchester Regional Airport Director Nicholas Sabo has argued to the Frederick County Board of Supervisors that the April 2018 increase in property taxes on aircraft based at the airport is hindering the airport; over the past year 7, of approximately one hundred tenants have left the airport and other businesses are avoiding the airport.

For the fifth year in a row, Chantilly Air's maintenance team has been awarded the FAA's Diamond Award of Excellence for Aviation Maintenance Technician (AMT) Training.
